> Updates from Cosgrove Care

We're pleased to share several important updates and developments across our services. These changes reflect our ongoing commitment to improving the quality of support we provide and ensuring accessibility, and collaboration with the people we support, their families, and professionals.

New Provision of Services Document& Cancellation Policy

Cosgrove has developed a new **Provision** of **Services** document designed to bring together all the key information that supported individuals, their families or guardians, and professionals need to know. This includes:

- Our mission, vision, and values
- · How we are regulated and monitored
- Support planning and medication management
- Payment processes for additional services
- Our updated *Cancellation Policy*, which now includes extended notice periods to help us better plan staffing

This document has been reviewed by our Board of Trustees, Care and Governance Committee, Family Forum, and service managers. We expect to publish the final version soon, with implementation planned for early in the new year. We'll be in touch with all supported individuals and guardians in the coming weeks.



> Student Placements

We're proud to offer meaningful student placements for aspiring social workers. Over the past year, we've hosted:

- · 3 final-year students from UWS, Glasgow Caledonian, and Strathclyde
- · 5 observational placements for 2nd-year students from Strathclyde

Our in-house Practice Educator provides weekly professional supervision, supported by trained Link Workers who offer day-to-day guidance. These placements not only benefit students but also enrich our services. We look forward to continuing this work and supporting the next generation of social workers.

> Group Charging Policy Review

Each year, we review the costs of our groups and activities. Thanks to fundraising, we're able to offer these at a reasonable cost, including:

- · Adults: Wellbeing, Drama, Art, Social Sundays
- Children & Young People: Weekend Warriors, holiday activities

We understand that financial pressures are affecting many supported people and families, and we're currently reviewing our **charging policy** to ensure no one misses out on support due to cost. We're also actively pursuing grant funding to help sustain and expand our offerings.

> Tagtronics System Improvements

We've been working to improve our Tagtronics system, which we use for scheduling support, data collection, and secure storage. However, it can do more and we want to make use of all its capabilities. So, we brought together a working group of staff and managers who collaborated with developers to implement enhancements—some structural, some process, and others more visible, such as improved app functionality.

Next step is offering training to our support staff early in the new year and communicating any changes you might need to know using the family app.
